## The 2023 Game Changers are:

- WEEI Host, Nick "Fitzy" Stevens. The Braintree native has emceed several events for the Foundation, including the 2022 JAF Gala. His dedication and enthusiasm for the Foundation helped JAF reach its goals for two major fundraisers.
- Boston-based <u>5 Tool Productions</u>. 5 Tool Productions was co-founded by Tyler Pyburn and Phil DiMartino
  and has worked with JAF for five years. They help clients produce video content such as hybrid events,
  feature stories, live-streaming, fundraising videos, and anything in between.
- Oncology Social Services Manager at <u>Women's & Infants Hospital</u>, Dana D'Alessandro. D'Alessandro is a
  member of JAF's Healthcare Council, where she has provided valuable insight conveying the needs of
  cancer patients. She's participated in the Falmouth Road Race running for team JAF five years in a row
  and the Newport Night Run twice for team JAF.
- Founder and CEO of <u>Granite Telecommunications</u>, Rob Hale, and his wife, Karen Hale. The Hales are longtime supporters of the Foundation. In 2022, Rob Hale gave \$52 million to 52 grassroots nonprofits (\$1 million per organization) and the Joe Andruzzi Foundation was among one of those to receive funds.
- Boston-based <u>The Castle Group</u>. The Castle Group, co-founded by Wendy Spivak and Sandy Lish, began collaborating with JAF in 2019. During the COVID-19 pandemic, The Castle Group put the full weight and force of its event team behind JAF to create a new fundraising model the JAF Virtual Gala. Through their help and support, the Foundation was able to put on two successful virtual events and sustain its largest fundraisers.
- Foxborough, Massachusetts resident Todd Patkin is a new supporter of the Foundation and has committed to helping JAF reach out to cancer patients across New England.

"We are thrilled to announce this year's Game Changers," said Joe Andruzzi, Co-Founder and Chief Engagement Officer, Joe Andruzzi Foundation. "We are thankful to have them on our team as we continue to fulfill our mission to help those in need to receive treatment and help those who are facing food insecurity, transportation issues, and who are struggling to pay off bills."

In 2022, more than \$1.25 million was distributed in direct assistance to help 3,762 individuals with financial assistance to pay for housing, transportation, utilities, food, insurance, and other household expenses.
